Business

Rossknecht moved, Weiczorek seconded and motion carried unanimously to approve the minutes from the August 19, 2021 meeting.

21TP019 – Acknowledge the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #21-002A (Information Only). Harrington reviewed the 2021-2024 TIP Amendment #21-002A. This amendment defers the preliminary engineering for two Bridge Improvement Grant projects to be let in conjunction with a separate construction project.

There was no action taken on this item.

21TP020 – Acknowledge the Coordinated Public Transit – Human Services Transportation Plan 2021 Annual Update (Information Only). The Coordinated Public Transit - Human Services Transportation Plan was approved in March 2019 and identifies the gaps and needs in transportation related to persons with disabilities, seniors and individuals with low incomes. The plan provides strategies to fix these gaps and needs, followed by priorities for implementing these strategies. An inventory of participating transportation providers was also provided. Agencies interested in receiving federal funds to help pay for vehicles, such as buses or vans, participated in this locally developed, coordinated public transit - human services transportation plan. This Annual Update identifies the 2021 accomplishments and on-going tasks as well as those not yet initiated and/or scheduled for next year. Rapid Transit System's primary focus in 2021 was to



continue to provide safe and efficient transportation while addressing the unique challenges presented by Covid-19. Brennan reviewed the Annual Update.

21TP021 – Approve the 2022 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) – Draft Report. Harrington reviewed the 2022 UPWP – Draft Report which includes the annual activities, planning studies, and products to be developed by the Metropolitan Planning Organization for 2022. The Unified Planning Work Program also identifies funding and staffing for conducting these tasks.

Fisher moved, Weiczorek seconded and motion carried unanimously to approve the 2022 Unified Planning Work Program – Draft Report.
