## **Business**

**21TP022 – Approve the 2022 Unified Planning Work Program – Final Report.** Harrington reviewed the 2022 UPWP – Draft Report which includes the annual activities, planning studies, and products to be developed by the Metropolitan Planning Organization for 2022. The Unified Planning Work Program also identifies funding and staffing for conducting these tasks.

**21TP023 – Approve the Greater Northwest Passenger Rail Working Group Letter of Support.** The Greater Northwest Passenger Rail is an organization focused on bringing passenger rail service to the northwest portion of the country, an area which is lacking in rail connections. Additional options for transportation modes will enhance tourism, manufacturing, and other aspects of our growing economy. Harrington reviewed this letter of support.

# There was no action taken on this item.

21TP024 – Approve the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplement Apportionment Act (CRRSA) and American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) Funding Recommendations. The CRRSAA/ARP Grant Assistance program is intended to enhance mobility of seniors and individuals with disabilities. Eligible assistance activities are payroll, operating costs, and capital costs for purchase of personal protection equipment. Two organizations submitted applications for review. The scoring committee, which is composed of Rapid City Staff and a MPO representative, recommends granting \$18,820 to Black Hills Works for three full time driver salaries representing 1255 total hours. The scoring committee



also recommends granting Prairie Hills Transit \$23,345 for a part time driver and administrator salaries. These funds will help to assist in eliminating transportation gaps identified in the Coordinated Public Transit – Human Services Transportation Plan. Brennan reviewed these recommendations.

## There was no action taken on this item.

**21TP025 – Acknowledge the 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment #22-001A.** Harrington reviewed this amendment which adds a State Highway System Urban Project to convert the US Highway 16 and Fort Hayes Drive intersection from a full access intersection into a right-in/right-out intersection to increase operational safety.
